Definitions

Ableism: Ableism is the discrimination of and social prejudice against people with disabilities based on the belief that typical abilities are superior. At its heart, ableism is rooted in the assumption that disabled people require ‘fixing’ and defines people by their disability.

Accessibility: The quality of being easily used, entered, or reached by people with disabilities; refers to the design of products, devices, services, curricula, or environments.
Reasonable accommodation: An adjustment or modification to a job or work environment that allows an individual with a disability to apply for a job, perform the essential functions of the job, or enjoy benefits equal to those offered to employees who do not have a disability.

How to talk about accessibility

Consider a capacity-based approach. When we talk about accessibility, we anticipate human differences. We consider that each person brings an idiosyncratic style and approach to their workplace. Conversations about disability can easily fall into the trap of talking about what people “can’t” do. Instead, veer towards a capacity-based approach: First consider what strengths each person brings to their workplace, regardless of their disability. Ask yourself what obstacles prevent all employees from doing their best work each day. If these barriers are removed, what possibilities open up? What can be done to remove these obstacles?
